PAGE AVE SCHOOL LANDS: FURTHER UPDATE

As we reported in our last newsletter an application for an amendment to the zoning by-law and subdivision approval for 21 single detached dwellings on the former Page Ave School lands went to North York community council in December 2010. It was approved – along with the need for a community information meeting with Councillor Shiner; and a final report to be ready before this summer. And that notice will now go to all single family homes within Bayview Village. **The meeting is tentatively scheduled for Tuesday, February 15 at 7 p.m. at Bayview Middle School**. Please attend this meeting. BVA (through BVA's Municipal & Government Affairs Committee) continues to monitor this application.

CONCORD ADEX LANDS (AKA: Canadian Tire Lands): FURTHER UPDATE

BVA's Municipal & Government Affairs Committee attended the fall consultation regarding the developers proposed new configurations. We, along with other concerned groups, raised many issues including amount of dedicated parkland, school attendance concerns, traffic and safety, building height (especially as it impacts view and sunlight), public use of lands, building design, and of course density. A staff report was being prepared and a Community Information Meeting is proposed for March of this year. BVA will continue to monitor this development on your behalf.



LET'S BEAT THE FLU! GET YOUR FREE FLU SHOT.

Everyone is at risk of getting the flu. The flu shot is the most effective way to prevent illness along with frequent handwashing. Because the viruses that cause the flu change frequently, it is necessary to get a shot every year to be protected. Public health has noted that many people have not yet received their free flu shot – and that there has been a considerable increase in the number of people with the flu.

Some develop complications and require hospitalization. Be safe – go to your family doctor.

The Province of Ontario provides access to Registered Dietitians to help you through *Eat Right Ontario*. DON'T LEAVE YOUR CAR WARMING UP IN THE DRIVEWAY: We keep repeating this alert. Cars continue to be stolen while people leave them running unattended – especially during very cold weather. One incident a couple of years ago saw a couple return from a brisk walk around the block only to see both of their cars being driven off down the street! Not a pretty sight.

BEWARE OF IDENTIFYING TOO MUCH INFORMATION WITH PHOTOS TAKEN WITH SMARTPHONES – Did you know that a simple photo taken with your Smartphone may contain exact details of where it was taken? And if that photo gets uploaded onto the internet – or emailed to someone who may take advantage - all sorts of details about you may be revealed. How is that possible – through **GEOTAGGING**.

WHAT IS GEOTAGGING?

- Geotagging is the process of adding geographical identification to photographs, video, websites and SMS messages. It is the equivalent of adding a 10-digit grid coordinate to everything you post on the internet.
- Geotags are automatically embedded in pictures taken with smartphones. Most people are unaware of the fact that photos taken with their smartphones and loaded to the Internet have been geotagged.
- Photos posted to photo sharing sites like Flickr and Picasa can also be tagged with location, but it is not an automatic function.
- One of the simplest ways to avoid displaying too much information is to disable the geotagging function on smartphones.
- Since most smartphones automatically display geographical information, it takes a little more effort on the user's part to protect their privacy.

Remember even if YOU do not post your photos to websites you or your children may send them to others who do! You may want to send someone your photo and actually be sending them address!

If you don't know how to disable this feature contact your local Smartphone provider and they will assist. Also be aware that even when you change this feature – pictures taken previously may still contain location information and you will need to ask about removing that from your photos.


Bridge Club Successful Bid!




**HISTORY 101: BAYVIEW VILLAGE -

PRESTO CARDS MAKE THEIR WAY INTO TORONTO

David Zimmer, MPP (Willowdale) has informed us that PRESTO cards for the GO Train are now in use at Don Mills Station. Soon the service will be available at the Finch station. For those of you who use the GO system it will make life a little easier. Especially as people increasingly commute across transit systems. For details go to: www.prestocard.ca

PRESTO allows commuters to travel between multiple transit systems using a single card. Users load it up with a dollar amount and "tap on" when boarding a bus or train. The fare is automatically deducted from the card. This eliminates the need for exact change, tickets or transfers to get on a bus, GO Train or subway.
